

Rules Of Closure Of Public Right-Of-Way

- A. Submit the completed form a MINIMUM OF 21 DAYS (3 weeks) prior to the event. Please create a map or sketch indicating your specific street closure plan, including the position of barricades, and attach it to the permit submission. Search "Street Closure Permit" on the City's home web page, www.gjcity.org, to view the application.
- B. Parks and Recreation staff will route the completed application to the Police Department, Fire Department, and Traffic Division.
- C. If approved, Parks and Recreation will create the Traffic Control Plan (TCP) and provide the signed permit form to the Applicant.
- D. All emergency vehicles will be allowed immediate access through the street if needed during the event; fire hydrant(s) cannot be blocked.
- E. The Permittee shall remove and properly dispose of all trash generated during the event. Recycling is encouraged.
- F. Alcohol must be served and consumed on private property. Alcohol is not permitted within the public right-of-way.
- G. The open or public consumption of marijuana is not allowed in/on the street(s), alley(s), sidewalk(s), bicycle path(s), trail(s), parking strip(s), or other public place(s) within the permitted area or any other place(s) or area open to the public and/or in or on an automobile(s) or other vehicle(s) located on public property or public right of way. If marijuana consumption occurs in public or outside a private residence, even if on private property, it is a violation. Any violation may be cause for revocation of this or any other City-issued permit and/or may be cause for other legal action(s) against the violator(s).
- H. Per City Ordinance Chapter §8.16.010, no unusually loud or unusual noise is allowed after 8:00 pm.
- I. The street is to be closed **ONLY** for the hours listed and **MUST** be done with barricade equipment, which we will provide to you. Instructions for equipment pickup from the City will be provided with the final permit. Barricade equipment must be picked up by the Applicant and promptly returned following the event.
- J. If your street closure includes a separate permit for one of our Block Party Trailers, you must use the equipment that comes with the Block Party Trailer and return it to its proper location after your event.
